# Step ALIVE! 23rd Walkathon

ALIVE!'s 23rd annual Walkathon for the ALIVE! Child Development Center (CDC), will be held *Sunday, May 2, 2004, beginning at 1:30 p.m.* Join us as we gather at First Christian Church, 2723 King Street to walk a 5-mile loop through Old Town past many of Alexandria's historic places of worship.

The Step ALIVE! Walkathon is the CDC's major fundraiser--last year we raised over \$16,000! The CDC is the only nationally accredited center in Alexandria providing high quality preschool and full-time childcare on a sliding fee scale for families who otherwise could not afford quality care. Although full tuition is \$170, parents pay an average of only \$80 per child per week. Due to cuts in state



# Crunchy on the Outside, Cozy on the Inside

Even though there are freezing temperatures outside, it is warm and cozy in the ALIVE! Child Development Center. The walls are filled with artwork shaped like hats and mittens, scarves and snowmen as we explore winter. The children had a paper snowball fight in the classroom, and the teachers lost! There was a lot of giggling going on.

The CDC has reached full enrollment, and there is currently a waiting list for all the classrooms. The services we offer are desperately needed in the community. Parents need a high quality, nationally accredited, affordable preschool so that they can feel good about leaving their children during the day while they work towards self-sufficiency.

We welcome children on childcare subsidy and our income-based tuition sets us apart from other early childhood education programs in Alexandria. On top of that, we have incredible nurturing teachers who absolutely adore the children!

# **Zero to Three Grant**

ALIVE! CDC is participating in a grant project through Zero to Three, an organization that advocates for young children based in Washington, D.C.

They recently received \$2 million to support preschool teacher education in Alexandria and encourage literacy in a developmentally appropriate manner. Zero to Three will provide coaches in the classrooms to help teachers develop strategies to improve literacy, and will pay for staff to further their professional education. Our children will benefit by developing a love of books, reading and writing. The CDC staff is participating 100% and is excited about this innovative program.

# **Housewares Room Re-Do**

Thanks to the efforts of Michael Karona, who is pursuing a Boy Scout Eagle Scout badge, ALIVE!'s Housewares Program room at Fairlington United Methodist Church has been completely renovated with brand new shelving and a beautiful coat of cheerful orange paint. Donated housewares are now neatly organized and more easily accessible by our volunteers.

# **Forrest Foundation Grant Award**

The CDC recently received a \$5,000 grant award for 2004 from the Washington Forrest Foundation. This grant will help us continue to offer income-based tuition rates to families who otherwise could not afford quality preschool and childcare. Parents only pay an average of \$80 per week per child at the CDC, even though full tuition is \$170 per week per child. We extend our sincerest thanks to the Washington Forrest Foundation for their support of our program.

# "The Fabulous 92"

ALIVE!'s Housewares Program has made several changes over the last year to deliver more housewares to a greater number of needy families and persons. We are excited about these measures to improve the efficiency and scope of our program.

We have expanded the number of housewares given away at Last Saturday Food Distribution sites so that over 150 families each month now receive needed basic household goods.

We have also recruited over 90 volunteers from Fairlington United Methodist Church so that housewares can be promptly delivered to needy families within days of a request. This group of volunteers was originally dubbed "The Fabulous 52" (to reflect our goal of recruiting one volunteer for each week of the year). But the response has been so great that we have renamed the group "The Fabulous 92"!

# 9/11 Assistance Project Going Strong

ALIVE!'s 9/11 Assistance Project is still going strong thanks to a generous grant from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. In the last six months, ALIVE! has provided almost \$141,000 of emergency financial help to 100 economic victims and their families — 156 adults and 104 children. Almost 60% of these victims have not been helped by the 9/11 Assistance Project before.

Recently ALIVE! paid back due rent to keep a cab driver and his family from being evicted. Since 9/11, this cab driver has only been making \$13,000 a year, and in the past few months, his wife has been unable to work as a daycare provider because of a difficult pregnancy.

"ALIVE! has been a life-line for these families struggling to catch-up — it's hard to imagine what would have happened to them without assistance from ALIVE!," said Ann Moore, Community Services Coordinator, Alexandria Department of Human Services.

## Let's Do the Numbers

#### -An Overview of

#### **ALIVE! Programs in FY 2003**

- Family Emergency Program responded to 2,959 requests for help with payments for rent, utilities and other critical needs.
- Last Saturday Food Program distributed a five-day supply of food to more than 500 families each month
- Food Program volunteers delivered a three-day supply of food to 1,504 individuals.
- Housewares Program volunteers delivered more than 1,100 housewares donations to 250 families.
- Furniture Program delivered over \$37,200 worth of donated furniture such as beds, dressers, tables and other basic furniture to approximately 200 families.
- ALIVE! Child Development Center offered affordable, full day, accredited, high quality early childhood education and wrap-around services to 46 children and their families.
- ALIVE! House Shelter provided a nurturing environment for women and families in emergency and transitional situations to assist 41 individuals in achieving an independent role in the community.
- · ALIVE! 9-11 Assistance Project helped 426 economic victims of the September 11th tragedies with funding from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and the United Way September 11th Fund.

# Family Emergency Assistance Up 42%

On New Year's Eve, Rick Glassco, ALIVE!'s volunteer Treasurer, wrote check number 50,000.

Since July 1, 2003, Rick has written 1,108 checks for emergency payments of rent, utilities, prescription medicine, and other urgent expenses for Alexandrians in need. ALIVE! has provided \$85,000 in emergency payments from July through December 2003, compared to \$60,000 last year—an increase of almost 42%.

ALIVE! budgeted more funds this year to provide help to needy Alexandrians through the Family Emergency Program than it has in any year since the program began more than thirty years ago. ALIVE!'s Family Emergency Program has paid over \$3 million to prevent Alexandrians from becoming homeless, to keep their lights and heat on, and to help them afford medical care and other necessities.

Of payments made July-December 2003, 47% went to prevent utility cut-offs; 26% went to pay for prescription medicines, office visits, and other medical expenses; and 21% went to pay for rent. This program also pays for bus tokens, work boots, tools, emergency childcare and other expenses to help Alexandrians find and keep jobs to become self-sufficient.

Those in need of financial help must have a social worker or member congregation request assistance from ALIVE!, and payments go directly to landlords, utility companies and other service providers.
