ALIVE! Reaches Out

ALIVE! is caught in the middle. In these difficult times, more and more people need the assistance that ALIVE! provides, such as food, shelter, and emergency monetary assistance to help pay the rent and keep the heat on. At the same time, many of ALIVE!'s usual sources of financial support are threatened. The State and City are faced with declines in revenue and are looking for expenses to cut. And ALIVE!'s grantmakers, concerned about the dramatic loss of value in their investment portfolios, have begun to notify ALIVE! that grants will be reduced or eliminated in the coming year.

So, squeezed from both ends, where can ALIVE! turn? First, ALIVE! turned to its loyal grass-roots volunteers and donors, and they have responded with generosity. Next, ALIVE! called upon its 41 affiliated congregations. Several have been able to respond with gifts exceeding their usual annual contributions, in honor of ALIVE!'s 40th anniversary and in recognition of the heightened demand for ALIVE!'s services. ALIVE! also has contacted businesses and associations that have provided support in the past. Thus far, nine have come forward as "40th anniversary sponsors" of ALIVE!'s work in this difficult year.

Where can ALIVE! turn next? You, who have received this *Wire*, are part of ALIVE!'s community. Perhaps you can refer ALIVE! to others who can help: perhaps to an unaffiliated congregation that is committed to the same mission, or to a business or association that has not engaged in ALIVE!'s work in the past, or to other generous individuals who may not know much about ALIVE! and the work that it does. The first is a Legacy Society in which individuals indicate that they have written or intend to write ALIVE! into their wills or other estate plans. A recent bequest from the estate of Mrs. Catherine Cole is an excellent example of what the ALIVE! Legacy Society can accomplish. Mrs. Cole came to this area from England after WWII. She and her late husband, Dr. Hugh M. Cole lived in the area for most of their 60 year marriage. What a wonderful tribute to her memory and what a wonderful gift to ALIVE!.

The second new program is the establishment of an Honor Roll of annual givers of substantial contributions. The gifts can come all at once or in installments during a year, helping smooth out ALIVE!'s income stream. People are not hungry just at Thanksgiving and Christmas!

The Honor Roll will have these categories: \$99 and under, Friend; \$100-\$249, Associate; \$250-\$499, Partner; \$500-\$999, Patron; \$1,000-\$9999 Leadership Circle; \$10,000 and up, Benefactor.

NEED CONTINUES TO GROW

With the downturn in the economy, the demand for food and assistance from ALIVE! has increased. For example, this winter in December and January, ALIVE!'s Last Saturday Food Distribution (LSFD) program provided bags of groceries to feed 4057 individuals, 41% more than the 2874 individuals served during the same period one year ago. In this environment, more and more large families need assistance, and ALIVE! plans and prepares for more clients every month.

During the last three months of 2008, ALIVE! provided food through both LSFD and the Family Emergency Program to 1509 households which included 4799 individuals. We were able to give \$47,798.82 in financial assistance to 520 household that needed help with medical expenses as well as rent and utilities helping to avoid evictions and utility cut offs. Furniture was delivered to 75 families and the Housewares Program helped more than 800 families. ALIVE! House sheltered women and children for a total of 393 total bed nights and the Child Development Center provided a preschool education to 38 children of Alexandria's working families, offering tuition fees based on family income.

We were able to do all of this because of the countless hours given by our wonderful volunteers and the generous financial donations from those who care. As you listen to the news about our economy, please don't forget those in need right here in our community.

Determination Begets Independence

Grilette Bates knew what she had to do – she understood the requirements of the ALIVE! House program - and she wanted the results it could bring her. Grilette had been a user, but when she came to ALIVE! House, in May 2004 she was free of that addiction and ready to concentrate on moving ahead with her life. Her goals were to unite her family, to live in her own place with her daughter and son, and to have a career. And she's done just that. All who watched the "12 Days of Giving" telecast in December saw a confident, attractive woman and a good advocate for the ALIVE! House program. Grilette saved money, paid off her debts, regained her driver's license and got her credit back together. She graduated from Training Futures, well prepared for her job as Accounts Assistant at General Dynamics. And, most importantly, she now has her children with her.

Grilette doesn't forget ALIVE! House; she comes back each year with her family and friends to participate in the Help the Homeless Walkathon. She was eager to share her experience during the Telethon. "Living at ALIVE! House is like living in your own apartment, (they're) not breathing over you. The Director (La Rue Barnes) opens up the opportunities available and gives you the encouragement to take advantage of them." It wasn't easy, but Grilette persisted knowing that her goals were worth the struggle. She is not through yet; she will continue her journey to independence by going to NOVA Community College and on to a BS degree.

ALIVE! House Renovation

HomeAid of Northern Virginia, one of our 40th Anniversary Sponsors, will be coordinating a major renovation of ALIVE! House beginning in March. HomeAid is the non-profit charitable arm of the Northern Virginia Building Industry Association (NVBIA) that builds and renovates homeless shelters. The ALIVE! House project, led by builder captain K. Hovnanian Homes, includes painting and new flooring throughout the building, improvements to the kitchenettes and bathrooms, as well as a new HVAC system.

Through their donation of time, expertise, and materials, K.Hovnanian and their subcontractors will drastically reduce the cost of the renovation for ALIVE! House. When the exact amount is determined, ALIVE! House will look for matching funds. ALIVE! House residents and staff will move off site during the renovation.

ALIVE! House, built in 1820, is the oldest continuously operating shelter for women in northern Virginia. It provides a safe shelter for women and families while helping them develop the necessary life skills to achieve independent living.
