

President's Message

Building on Strengths

During ALIVE!'s intensive strategic planning process, the Board has studied the many strengths and certain weaknesses that people inside and outside of ALIVE! have identified. Two key strengths stand out: 1) the strong and diverse congregational base that provides support in terms of both volunteers and doney,



food, furniture and housewares, and 2) the size, range and quality of programs ALIVE! operates.

While these strengths are key to ALIVE!'s success, it has been interesting for the Board to discover that many people in the community, and indeed in our affiliated congregations, know only of ALIVE!'s programs that provide emergency assistance. They are largely unaware of ALIVE!'s efforts to help families become self-reliant: the nationally accredited ALIVE! Child Development Center (CDC) and ALIVE! House that provides emergency shelter and services to women and their families.

Both the CDC and ALIVE! House help families in very different ways to help themselves dramatically improve their lives. At the CDC, ALIVE! provides an all-day, year-round program so that parents can work while their children are being taught the many skills needed to start kindergarten on the same level as other children. And at ALIVE! House we are helping mothers and their children pull their lives back together, find work and learn how to be self-sufficient, self-reliant families.

A major focus of the Board over the next year will be to grow awareness of the full range of programs provided by ALIVE! and to strengthen the relationships with affiliated congregations. We want to ensure that members of our congregations understand how their donations are making a difference in the lives of families throughout Alexandria and how they can become involved in all of ALIVE!'s programs.

Thousands of individuals are helped by ALIVE! each month, and the Board is committed to continuing and expanding that support as long as we have neighbors in Alexandria who are in need. We hope you will help us build on our strengths.

Every once in a while we see something or become aware of a situation and think, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." Especially since the beginning of the recession, we've had many new clients, folks who had never needed ALIVE!'s help before and, in some cases, were even volunteers or contributors. Such was the case with a woman I'll call "Angela". She was a typical working middle class woman, living in a nice apartment here in the City. Then, through a reorganization, she lost her job. If that wasn't bad enough, while still unemployed and searching for work, she became seriously ill. As is often the case, unemployment ran out, resources dried up and she fell behind on her rent.

ALIVE! Participates in the Virginia Neighborhood Assistance Program!

The Virginia Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) is a program developed by the Commonwealth of Virginia that provides state tax credits as an incentive for businesses and individuals to contribute directly to non-profit organizations, such as ALIVE!, that serve economically disadvantaged citizens. We are one of the few organizations in Virginia which are approved to distribute these tax credits.

Eligible individuals making charitable contributions to ALIVE! may receive tax credits valued at 40% of their donation. This is a direct dollar-for-dollar credit against taxes owed to the state, not a deduction. As an example, an individual who donates \$500 can claim a \$200 state tax credit, which will lower their tax bill by \$200. This is <u>in addition</u> to any deductions a donor might normally claim on a charitable gift.

Forty Years of Quality Preschool

It was 1972 when the fledgling "Mothers of Arlandria" was threatened with closure and the Reverend Chris Hobgood, pastor of First Christian Church on King Street, said, "ALIVE!, this is something you need to take on." The program had lost its federal funding and was seeking a home so that the newly-employed mothers would not lose their source of child care and preschool for their children.

Reverend Hobgood offered classroom space in the educational wing of his church, Mrs. Barbara Green, trained in the preschool methodology of Maria Montessori, volunteered to serve as the preschool director and the ALIVE! Child Development Center (CDC) was born. Now, forty years later, the ALIVE! CDC stands out in Alexandria as a quality preschool opportunity for 38 children. Nationally accredited by the NAEYC (National Association for Education of Young Children) and holding a Virginia Quality Rating Improvement System rating of four stars, the CDC offers the families of children a sliding-scale tuition

based on total family income and their ability to pay. The CDC also offers a full-day, year-round program that is very important to working parents.

Barbara Green served as Director for seven years, followed by Sister Marita Ellis who directed the center for five years. The first "paid" director was a ten year tenured CDC teacher, Mrs. Ruby Tucker who was appointed in 1983 and remained in that position for approximately 15 years, a record so far. Though our first three directors are no longer alive, their legacies live on in the care, commitment, professionalism and devotion to the ALIVE! CDC children in the person of our current Director, Pam Blankenship.

Congratulations to the ALIVE! Child Development Center for 40 years of service to the children of our community.
