ALIVE! is ALIVE! because of the dedication of so many! What a service Deborah Patterson has provided ALIVE! during her two-year presidency that wrapped up at the end of June – and for her over 15 years of service to ALIVE! in so many other ways. Thank you, Deborah!

ALIVE!'s traditional change in leadership on July 1st coincides with ALIVE!'s fiscal year, including the adoption of an organizational budget for Fiscal Year 2017. Adopted at the June meeting, the ALIVE! Fiscal Year 2017 budget supports critical programming that addresses emergency needs through the provision of food, financial assistance, furniture and housewares. Programming that supports self-sufficiency for Alexandrians through the operation of ALIVE! House and the ALIVE! Child Development Center is also included in the FY17 budget. However, reductions at various levels amongst all the programs were necessary to match the revenue projections expected this year. As part of its fiscal responsibility, ALIVE!'s Board is committed

to continued due diligence of budgeting for the next two years – and beyond, revisiting the organization's strategic plan, understanding community needs and making difficult decisions that align mission, needs and revenues.

The reality is that budgets serve as valuable roadmaps to setting priorities and strengthening the organization. As we venture into this new fiscal year, ALIVE!'s work will continue on a path that includes discernment about where our resources are most needed and best utilized to continue to fulfill the ALIVE! mission in today's world. Thanks to the commitment of the Alexandria community, volunteers, donors and our partners, I believe ALIVE!'s path will continue to make an important difference in the lives of our neighbors in need.

House prepare for the Sidewalk Sale by cleaning up outside, unloading tables and packing the truck with donations for the sale. Although they had to brave the rain, they did a fantastic job! As a bonus, one volunteer stayed at ALIVE! House to unpack toys and set-up the new playroom. Alexandria's Department of Finance employees were energetic and fun, ensuring we were prepared for the Sidewalk Sale. We could not have held the Sidewalk Sale without them! \$5,000 was raised for ALIVE! House at this year's Sidewalk Sale. Thank you to <u>all</u> the volunteers who made it a real success!

Thanks to Rebuilding Together Alexandria and the volunteer team of 20 Wells Fargo employees, ALIVE! House was the beneficiary of several upgrades and renovations on National Rebuilding Day on April 30th. Led by Wells Fargo Team Captain (and Rebuilding Together Board Member) Jay Bradley, the volunteers created a new playroom for the children and an enhanced living space for the residents. The transformed playroom also includes a work space for the mothers to do homework, job search, etc. The Rebuilding Together Alexandria (RTA) work also included updates to the resident manager apartment and the office area. Because of RTA and Wells Fargo, the children have a safe place to play and ALIVE! House feels more like a home.

ALIVE! Food Happenings

ALIVE!'s Food Program continues to serve Alexandria's hungry families through the Last Saturday Food Distribution Program. Additionally, ALIVE! is partnering with other agencies to provide more food to new and existing clients. Because of community support, ALIVE! is underway in securing more donated food to meet these growing partnerships.

The Last Saturday Food Distribution Program distributed over 30,000 pounds of food to approximately 2,000 individuals in 550 households each of the last three months. Volunteers continue to be key to implementing this large food distribution program every month!

The U.S. Postal Service Letter Carrier's food drive in May brought in approximately 10,000 pounds of food donated by area residents and collected by their letter carriers. This annual food drive is sponsored by the Letter Carrier Union. Each year, ALIVE! is amazed at the *above and beyond* work of the letter carriers to ensure such a successful food drive. Many thanks to the volunteers who were stationed at two area postal facilities where they gathered the food as the carriers brought it in, pre-sorted it, loaded it onto ALIVE! trucks, and unloaded it at The Alexandria Food Center/ALIVE! warehouse. The next day 40 volunteers sorted the food into 180 boxes, now ready for distribution this summer.

The new ALIVE! Weekend Care Bag Program, which provides single-serving meals, snacks and juice to 200 atrisk children from four Alexandria City Public Schools each weekend during the school year, winds down for the summer when other support programs kick-in for children. ALIVE!'s goal is to serve more children when school reopens in the fall. This program is a joint effort amongst ALIVE!, school and community partners.

ALIVE! continues to build relationships with a number of organizations throughout Alexandria to provide food to clients in the weeks between the monthly food distributions. Current partners include Community Lodgings, who receives midmonth food for a number of its clients, and the Alexandria Redevelopment and Housing Authority Ruby Tucker Center, where ALIVE! supplies emergency breakfast items for children who spend time at the center during the summer. ALIVE! joined others in the community to provide snacks for children participating in programs at the Durant Recreation and Arts Center during spring break.



Thank you to the Alexandria Lion's Club for hosting a food drive in June at the Bradlee Safeway – and to everyone who donated food! ALIVE!'s Food Program welcomes other groups who wish to organize a food drive this summer or fall!



May was Community Action Month for Alexandria City employees and the Office of Community Services volunteered with ALIVE!
